Spread Spectrum Leader Delivers Keynote at ISA EXPO/2000

Recent Advances in Spread Spectrum—The Latest in Wireless Technology



Keynote Address—H. Britton Sanderford, Jr., founder and president of Axonn Corporation 8:30-9:30 a.m., Monday 21 August Ernest N. Morial Convention Center

Recent advances in spread spectrum technology have opened the door to an entirely new class of process monitoring architecture that has the potential to bring about significant changes in the rules governing industrial automation. Driven by huge cost savings in installation and logistics, as well as dramatic improvements in the frequency and reliability of field data collection, automation experts and

IS professionals are presented with an opportunity to deliver a major, positive impact to their company's bottom line.

Sanderford plans to explore these attributes of spread spectrum technology, which are essential for successful DA systems. They include the total elimination of wires to include power management of sensors, allowing 3–10 years of battery life. Sanderford will also review actual field experience from various wire-free applications, including various liquid level sensors, temperature and vibration sensors and 12 bit analog inputs and outputs.

Sanderford founded Axonn Corporation in 1985. The company filed its first spread spectrum patent in 1986.


